This roundtable is organized within the “ARIADNE Network- Human Trafficking and Migration in SE and Eastern Europe” project funded by the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the “Program of Cooperation in the Black Sea Region in the Area of Migration between countries of Origin, Transit and Destination” (Black Sea Migration Project) funded by the European Union.
